PUBLIC WORKS

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 28.842 million gallons during this reporting period, February 13 - February 19, up from 27.956 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 4.957 million gallons occurred on Thursday, February 19. There were 0.78 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- An estimated loss of 797,782 gallons occurred, including one water main break.
- Crews responded to three sewer backup calls and turned valves off for contractors on W. Camp Wisdom Rd. for a future shutdown.

Solid Waste Division

- The Solid Waste Division received six concerns: one trash, two brush, two bulk, and one special collection. Seven recycling bins were distributed.

Street Division

- Removed fallen trees from right-of-way on Santa Fe, totaling four cubic yards.
- Patched forty-two potholes in various locations.
- Repaired utility cuts on Lombard, Nature, and Willowbrook.
- Inspected thirty-four headwalls, cleaned four, and removed three cubic yards of trash and debris.
- Repaired sidewalks on Brookwood and Willowbrook.
- Marked twelve right-of-way locates.
- Flushed drainage pipe on Woodhaven.

CIP Construction:

- E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67)** – The Dallas Water Utilities water main line has been chlorinated and Bac-T samples were taken on February 22. Construction of water line 4 at Shady trail is underway and completion is expected early next week. Grading of the subgrade has started, with PaveCon currently working on the area between Sunrise and Sunset Village. Lime treatment at the eastbound subgrade is scheduled for February 28 through March 2. Nighttime paving is scheduled to begin on Monday, March 13, and will be completed between 9:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. Since lime treatment is delayed, paving may also be postponed due to the cure time required for lime treatment. Concrete placement for the sidewalks and turn lane will occur after the nighttime paving is complete and during the regular working hours. The eastbound lanes are anticipated to open on April 24.

- The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project** – Green Ribbon Project construction is substantially complete. Full completion, including seasonal planting, is scheduled for Spring 2023. The landscape monuments at Cockrell Hill Rd. and Highway 67 are complete. Both monuments are permanently illuminated.




- **Fire Station 271** – Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement with CORE Construction to construct the new Fire Station 271 in June 2022. The Construction Kickoff meeting was held on August 10, 2022, and monthly progress meetings started on September 7. Construction has commenced. The Fire Station 271 Groundbreaking Ceremony is being rescheduled. The contractor has poured the slab for the building foundation and is preparing for underground utilities via directional boring. Completion of the fire station is slated for Fall 2023.




Other Construction

- **ONCOR Line Work in the vicinity of the Downtown District** – ONCOR is upgrading the electrical line along Daniel St., Main St., Center St., Freeman St., and Wheatland Rd. The upgrades will improve the electrical system's capacity in that area. Work has commenced.



- **TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd. to Hampton Rd.** – TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd. in Duncanville to Hampton Rd. in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, TXDOT will construct the US-67 Cockrell Hill Rd. Texas U-Turn on the southwest side of the bridge. The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction Meeting with TXDOT and the contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of January 2025. The Texas U-Turn at Cockrell Hill and Highway 67 is under construction.

Building and Inspection

- A total of 1,865 single-family rental properties have been registered to date. Seventeen inspections were completed since the previous update; three passed, ten failed, and four were canceled. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were absence of GFCI protection, as well as missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. A total of 1,352 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.
- Since the start of active lien collection in 2019, \$386,008.38 has been collected. \$13,989.11 has been collected since January 1, 2022. \$184.67 was collected this week.
- This week 49 permits were issued, and 129 inspections were conducted. To date we have inspected 11 mobile vending units.
- The City's new Building Official, Mark Hardin, begins employment on February 27.

Neighborhood Services

- Neighborhood Service Officers conducted 89 inspections, including re-inspections, and have 39 open cases.

 - The civil plan was submitted on February 9 for pre-review prior to submitting the building permit.

- Costco Fuel Expansion at 250 West Highway 67:

 - An updated site plan will be required when submitting the permit application; any new signage will also require permits.
 - Planning will require updated landscaping and photometric plans.

- The Fire Prevention Division completed thirty-two inspections, and two permit inspections.
- Emergency Management Operations Coordinator Lauren Sanchez led a class on child reunification with the Duncanville Police Department officers and staff.




